Stanley Fredrick Gibson, Sr., 80 of Beebe, Arkansas, went to be with the Lord on Saturday, December 7, 2019. He was born on May 6, 1939 in Skene, Mississippi.

"Freddie" loved his family, friends, and all his former students with all his heart. After three years in the Marines, he graduated from Delta State College in Cleveland, Mississippi. He was a coach and math teacher at Palestine High School. He went on to Bradford High School to coach and teach, then later became principal. He was also a teacher and principal at McRae High School. He then went to White County Central as a Superintendent. He ended his thirty years in education at the Arkansas State Department of Education.

Freddie was preceded in death by his parents, Charles Marion, Sr. and Mollie Short Gibson, brothers, Charles Gibson, Jr. and Walter Gibson, sisters Nell Benson and Janie Herrera.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Mary Louise, of Beebe, son, Stan Gibson, Jr. (Norie) of Irvine, CA, daughter, Torrey McNully, of Beebe, a sister, Mary Ann Davenport of Des Moines, IA, four grandchildren, Amanda (Husai) and Maika Gibson and Erin and Ethan McNully, as well as many cousins, nieces, and nephews.
