Alice Ann Hawkins Kellar passed away peacefully at her daughter's home on Saturday, September 28, 2024. She was 94 years old. Born on March 8, 1930, in Stamps, to Harry P. and Alva Formby Hawkins, Alice Ann grew up in Waldo, where she graduated from Waldo High School. Following High School, she attended Harding College, where she met her husband of almost 73 years, Wayne Kellar.
