Alva Gene Dugger went to be with Jesus on the 2nd day of August, 2014 at White County Medical Center in Searcy, AR. He was born on February 3rd, 1944 in Newport, AR to Alva Don Dugger and Myrtle Alice (Davis) Dugger. Alva Gene grew up in Newark, AR. He graduated from Newark High school in 1961.

After high school, he attended Harding University in Searcy, AR the fall of 1961. Alva Gene then attended Arkansas College from 1961 to 1965 where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics. He then attended the University of Missouri at Rolla in Rolla, MO where he studied math and computer science and graduated with a Master's of Science in 1969.

Alva Gene began teaching mathematics for Harding University in 1969. After a short hiatus to continue graduate work, he returned to Harding to direct the first Computer Center. Alva Gene continued his career as a college professor for 45 years.

Alva Gene married his high school sweetheart, Frances Earlene (Magness) Dugger in Newark, AR on December 22nd, 1961. They were happily married for 52 years. He was a member of College church of Christ in Searcy, AR.

Alva Gene enjoyed spending time in the great outdoors and "headed to the woods" as often as possible. He channeled his love of Jesus, the outdoors and riding motor cycles into a ministry of helping young people to experience the Creator through nature and riding. He was also an avid reader and student and loved to share both his books and his faith with others. Alva Gene's true

passion was teaching. As a professor of mathematics for 45 years he worked diligently every day to make a positive difference in his student's lives. He made it his mission to "coach" his students to success in mathematics and became affectionately known as "Coach" Dugger.

Alva Gene was preceded in death by his father, Alva Don Dugger.
