Stephanie soon had to share her parents with her little brother Dustin, who only added more joy to his parent's hearts. Even though Dustin became Ray's "little mini me," he was his mother's son, and the love of God that she instilled in him from an early age has brought him to the young man that she so loved and adored. The family continued to grow as Stephanie married Leonard, and Dustin married Logan, both of whom Belinda loved as her own.

Belinda also had three small bundles of endless joy wrapped up in her granddaughters. They would light up her face and her spirit when they entered the room.
