Betty Lou Rudd Walter, a lifelong resident of Judsonia, passed away at Searcy Hospice surrounded by her family December 18, 2007, after a hard-fought battle with cancer and diabetes. She was always known as a wonderful cook, and held that position at Oakdale Nursing Home and later at Judsonia 1st Baptist Church, where she had been a faithful member for more than 55 years.
