Billy J. Wood, 77, of Searcy, passed away peacefully January 20, 2012, at his home surrounded by family following a year long illness.

He is survived by his wife of 49 1/2 years, Flora (Duke) Wood; his son, David Wood and his wife Pam; his daughter, Julie Williams and her husband Charlie Williams and his four grandchildren, his pride and joy, Zach and Que Wood and Parker and Lindsey Salzman; a brother, Jerry and his wife Muriel of Missouri; a sister Kay and her husband Billy Vickers of Springdale; and sister Joyce Nail of Batesville.
