Charles Dale Van Patten, Sr., 87, of Searcy, died Monday, July 11, 2011. He was born December 2, 1923 in Pangburn, Arkansas, the son of I B and Linnie Ray Van Patten.

Dale is preceded in death by his parents and by a brother, Herman Van Patten.
