Chelsey Ann Koffler, resident of Overland Park, KS and former Searcy resident, died Friday afternoon in an automobile accident. She was 24 years of age.

Chelsey was born July 12, 1983 in Searcy, a daughter to Lyle and Cathy Dinkins Koffler. She was a member of St. James Catholic Church and attended the Church of the Nativity Catholic Church in Overland Park. Chelsey was an honor graduate of Searcy High School. 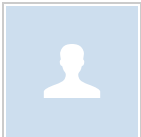
