



Commadore "Kinky" King, Jr.

July 26, 1925 - June 3, 2011

Commadore "Kinky" King, Jr., 85, of Searcy, died Friday, June 3. He was born July 26, 1925 in Huffman, Arkansas, the son of Commadore and Ola Morris King.

During WWII, Kinky played with Cindy Walker on Radio Programs and USO tours. He then toured with Ms. Billie Walker and her Western Swing Band. After WWII, when his brother came out of the Navy, they formed the "Dixie Swing Kings", playing over the Mid-South. Later, he was the band manager for the Tommy Trent Band and appeared on local TV shows in the early years of live TV bands. In 2006, Kinky was inducted into the Western Swing Hall of Fame.

Kinky is survived by his wife of 63 years, Dolores King.

He is preceded in death by his parents, a brothers, John "Bud" King, Clinton "Kenny" King, Albert Meacham, Hadley King, and Howard King; sisters Rosie Leggett, Effie Moody, Geraldine Pratt, Mildred Brown and Adele Wood.
