E. J. Moore, 81, of Searcy, died Sunday, November 6, 2011. He was born on the XIT Ranch near Enochs, Texas, January 25, 1930, the son of John Alvin and Vera Lee Lilly Moore.

Mr. Moore was a member of the College Church of Christ and a retired teacher and farmer. He served in the 124th Armored Cavalry of the Texas National Guard. E. J. attended Abilene Christian College where he played on the only undefeated 1950 collegiate team, that also won the Refrigerator Bowl that year.
