Frank Yingling, 85, of Judsonia, died Monday, March 17, 2008 in Searcy. He was born in Judsonia June 6, 1922 a son of the late Jim and Myrtle Buice Yingling. Frank was a long time member of the Bethel Grove Church of Christ where he served as deacon. He was very active in the county, having served on the Federal Land Bank Board of Directors, the F.H.A. Board, the North White County Water Board and the White County Central School Board. He was past vice president of the White County Farmers Union and in 1962, his family was selected White County Farm Family of the Year.

Mr. Yingling was a veteran of the Army-Air Corp and served in Italy during WWII. He loved the land and enjoyed making his living from the land. Frank was a man of integrity and will be missed by all who knew him.

He is survived by his wife of 61 years, Ardelle (Moore) Yingling; sons, Jimmie Yingling (Sue) of Judsonia and Larry Yingling (Donna) of Searcy; a daughter, Sandra Lenoard of Judsonia; five grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by three sisters, three brothers and a grandson.

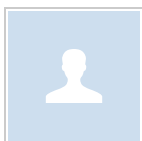

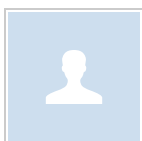

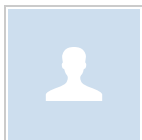
