July 30, 1943 - April 17, 2011

Gerald W. Lawrence, age 67, of Searcy, died Sunday April 17, 2011 at St. Vincent Hospital. He was born July 30, 1943 to the late Richard and Zola Pope Lawrence in Zion, Missouri. Gerald retired from the United States Air Force after 22 years; he was a helicopter mechanic and participated in rescue missions during Vietnam.
