Gerry Gentry, age 93, passed away in her home on Wednesday, August 28, 2013. She was born October 31, 1919, in Sidon, Arkansas, to Susan Mary Francis Singleton and A. M. Vaughan. She attended Searcy and Pangburn schools and Arkansas Teachers College (Lyon University) in Batesville, Arkansas. She taught school for a short time before marrying Readus D. Gentry of Searcy on November 7, 1941. They moved to various states due to his work with Texas Eastern Transmission Corp., retiring in 1982 and returning to Searcy, in 1983.

She was a faithful, loving member of: First Baptist Church of Joaquin, Joaquin, Texas; Mobberly Avenue Baptist Church, Longview, Texas; Faith Assembly of God Church, Searcy, Arkansas and served as a Gideon's wife . She taught Sunday school, supervised vacation bible schools, mentored young women, and was a loving friend to many. 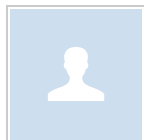
