Joe Leeland Brimer, age 57, of Bald Knob, died Thursday, October 11, 2007 in Searcy. Joe was born December 21, 1949 in Clarendon a son of Judge and Maybell Hyatt Brimer. He had served many years as an educator in the public school system and was known for his love of children. He taught for 20 years in the Gosnell School District and coached basketball, football and track. He was known as the winningest coach in elementary basketball in Gosnell history. He returned to the Bald Knob area in 2000 and began teaching in the Newport School District until March of this year. He was a 1967 graduate of Bald Knob High School and graduated from Arkansas State University at Jonesboro. Joe had a great love for singing and playing the guitar and was an avid Elvis Presley collector. He served as song leader at the Bald Knob Church of Christ where he was a member. He was a very special husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend.

He is survived by his wife of 36 years, Jeannie (Cox) Brimer; sons, Marcus (Danielle) Brimer and Dwayne Brimer all of Bald Knob; mother, Maybell Brimer of Bald Knob; 4 grandsons, Joel, Jacob, James and Jacy Brimer; 5 brothers, R.V. (Phyllis) Brimer, Charles Brimer, Alton Brimer all of Bald Knob, Dean (Linda) Brimer of Searcy, James Brimer of Mississippi He was preceded in death by his father, brother, Judge Brimer, Jr. and a nephew, Darrin Brimer. You probably won't remember me, but I came to Gosnell High School in 1997, following the death of my husband, Steve (38 years old at his passing), also an avid Elvis fan. I can relate to you in other ways, as well. My heart goes out to you as I think of all that you are experiencing with the loss of the most significant person in your life, your sweetheart. I'm sure that you had planned many happy years together; then, in a moment ... (by our vantage point) too young for this journey - yet, only the Lord knows "why". I only knew Joe for a short time, but I have a huge lump in my throat and tears streaming as I think of you and your loss. You can be very proud that he walked in such a way that he will not be forgotten (because his life of integrity, may - at his passing - cause others to reflect and decide to take the same path for their life here on Earth; ... that he did not live in vain is bound to be a comfort to you. No doubt, many will have more urgency to dwell on and desire to arrive in Heaven, than ever before.) I will never forget his easy smile, for all; gentle words, when needed; the kindness ever-flowing; and expression of concern for others. He was a small man, yet great in stature due to the principles by which he lived his daily life as a professional ... ; an example to co-workers, students, and those in the community. As a school employee I observed the brilliantly shining light of the application of the teachings of the Master Teacher whom he chose to follow. He let Christ's love shine out of his heart, while he was a reflection of His image. (My Steve led singing for the Church of Christ, as well. He lived the lessons which he sang, as did Joe.) In summing up the man who I knew as a Gosnell educator, I would have to say that your Joe was the epitome of the Christian man that God intended. (That is the solace that I had in knowing the same of my husband; but that is also the characteristic that caused me to miss him, terribly. There is no way to totally console you or describe the void that exists in your heart and life at this most difficult of times; a time when he is absent from your side - just as you need him the most.) You (and your family) are in my thoughts and prayers at this time, and will continue to be in the days, weeks, months, and years ahead; especially during special times when families gather
