John was born in Cambridge, England on December 18, 1957. He moved to the United States shortly after he was born and moved around as a part of a military family. He served others by cooking really good food for the masses, grilling and smoking meats to raise money for charity, teaching bible class to both young and old, and working on people's cars.
