Johnnie Lynn Swaims, Sr., 65, of Batesville died, Wednesday, September 2, 2009 at the White River Medical Center. Johnnie was born December 25, 1943 in Batesville and was the son of the late Johnnie Case Swaim and Thelma Pearl Fitzsimmons McDonald. He was a 1961 graduate of Cushman High School where he was active in sports. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army and then served in the Army National Guard for many years. Upon his honorable discharge with the Guard he was Staff Sergeant with the military police. He was a retired Little Rock Police Officer having served from November 22, 1971 - February 6, 1992. During his career he was certified by the FBI - Narcotics, Vice and Counter Intelligence. He received numerous awards and recognition through the years and was named police officer of the month three different times. He was of the Baptist faith, a Master Mason with the Bell Lodge #322 in Bethesda and was also a master mechanic.
