“ Joseph Charles "JC" Roe was my teacher at Bragg City High School in Bragg City, MO. He taught there for a few years in the 50's, his picture is in the 1955, 1956, yearbook that I have. I have many wonderful memories of JC and his wife Mary. Once we were playing a basketball game, (one on one or two on two) in the summer when school was out, I went up for a jump shot and he went up to block the shot, I always kicked my foot out when doing a fade-away. Well, in doing this my foot hit his shin bone and it parted my two little toes from the other toes and broke both of the two little toes, he was so kind and took me to the home economics room and ran water over them till better. One week later they were still hurting so went to Dr., x-rayed and they were broke, Dr. said put foam between them, wrap with tape, put your shoe on and you will be OK, Not only was he an excellent athlete, he was one of the best teachers that I had. He taught me one course in science that formed my foundation for the field that I selected. I got to talk to him on the phone a year or so ago and I am so thankful for that. I have many other fond memories of this kind, honest, moral, and God Fearing man. BCHS graduate 1957.
