December 12, 1942 - January 28, 2020

Lynn Campbell, 77, of Omaha, Texas, died Tuesday, January 28, 2020 at Community Compassion Center of Searcy. He was born December 12, 1942 in St. Louis, Missouri to the late Enloe Edwin Campbell and Joyce Pauline (Kitchen) Campbell. Raised in Steele, Missouri and later relocating to Central Florida. Lynn attended David Lipscomb College and graduated from Lake Sumpter Community College before enrolling in the Sunset School of Preaching in Lubbock, Texas. He began his ministry and missionary work with the church of Christ in 1964 and graduated from Sunset and married Allie Chastain in 1966. In 1967 the newlyweds moved to Northern Ireland to teach and preach. Lynn returned to the States in 1968 to join the inaugural faculty of the White's Ferry Road School of Preaching. This grassroots effort to teach preachers provided a network of relationships and connections that have continuously blessed Lynn and his family. While ministering with WFR, he and Allie along with other close friends, brainstormed ways to give children and young people access to Christian education. Ouachita Christian School is the result of these efforts. Lynn preached gospel meetings across the United States and served in the mission field whenever possible. His pulpit work in Louisiana, Florida, Arkansas, and Texas as well as his personal evangelism work, created deep connections and relationships with people across the world. Lynn loved people and was particularly gifted at believing in people and using scripture to speak Truth and instill Hope. His heart for people led him to serve as a hospice chaplain and board member for Wadley Hospital in

Texarkana. Lynn enjoyed anything outdoors including fishing and hunting; and he spent the last several years custom bailing hay for his friends and neighbors. The most important thing to Lynn was relationship and the Resurrection, both of which provided him great strength and hope. He is survived by his wife, Allie (Chastain) Campbell; son, Michael Campbell (Roxie); daughters, Lynnita Walker (Chris), Anissa Harris (Greg), and Nita Ragsdale (Brian); 14 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Myrna Mahaney.
