Although she scoffed at being called a, "Bible Scholar," she had an understanding of the Scripture that is unequaled by most. She taught dozens of Sunday School classes covering all ages in churches around the state where Moran pastored. She cherished and found especially fulfilling the twenty-one years she taught the Senior Ladies' Class at First Baptist, Fordyce, Arkansas, where they lived after Moran retired from the ministry. Until her accident on August 16, Mom/Grandma really wasn't ninety-seven. Those meeting her for the first time thought she was a spring chicken in her seventies or maybe early eighties and were surprised to learn her real age . She was spry in demeanor, attitude, personality, as well as in her appearance. In her words, "I just try to look presentable." In our words she always looked like a "lady" from her fashionable little head to the tips of those pointy-toed, high-heeled shoes she so loved!

There seemed to be a mutual admiration between Margie and flowers. She loved them and they loved her in return although she sometimes spoke sternly to them and even "trimmed" them beyond recognition! They always came back and did their best to dazzle her with their beauty! Her gardens in Heaven are in for a treat! Her gardens left on earth are saddened but thankful for the love and care she gave so fully for such a long time.
