



Mary Evelyn Curtis

September 14, 1930 - September 24, 2024

Mary Evelyn Curtis left this life on September 24, 2024. She was born September 14, 1930 to Jesse and Thelda Hayes in Adamsville, TN. After high school she attended Harding College where she met Burl Curtis, a preacher student who became the love of her life. They were married for almost 70 years where they encouraged, supported and helped each other in all areas of their works. For seventeen years they worked in the mission field of South Carolina. Because of their love of God and each other, they made a great team. Burl preached for five congregations, planting three of them. Side by side they conducted numerous home Bible studies, VBS's, campaigns, Bible camps, owned and operated a Christian book store. Evelyn continued her education at Clemson and the University of SC. Together they conducted almost 100 teacher workshops in twelve states.

After returning to Arkansas, Evelyn opened Curtis Kindergarten and pre-school. The school was very successful with a wonderful Christian staff of 24 and a long waiting list of students. In 1990 she received an award from Governor Bill Clinton as one of Arkansas' outstanding Child Care Professionals. In 2002 the Searcy Chamber of Commerce chose her as Business Woman of the Year. In 2007 she and her husband were given the key to the city by Mayor Belinda LaForce for their accomplishments and inspiration to others. In 2013 she received the Legacy of Women in God's Service by WINGS for many years of faithful dedication and ministry to others.

Because of her training, experience and genuine love of people she was given many opportunities to serve. She spoke often for Ladies Days, retreats, camps, Bible classes at church and Harding Place. She taught classes in Early Childhood at Vo-tech and conducted workshops for AACUS on both local and state levels. She taught continuing education classes for Headstart directors and teachers. She also conducted classes for wives of the preacher students at Harding University.

Although she had a productive life, she had much rather be remembered for her love of God, family and deep devotion to her husband. She cherished the friendships of many wonderful ladies who enriched her life. She and her husband were faithful members of the College Church of Christ where they served in many capacities.

Mrs. Curtis is survived by her four children and their spouses, Larry Curtis (Claudia), Beth Hoofman (Joey), Becky McLain (Jeff), Kevin Curtis (Jennifer), fourteen grandchildren and thirteen great-grandchildren.
