Matthew “Logan” Plummer, 21, of Bald Knob, Arkansas received his heavenly wings on Thursday, March 28, 2024.

He graduated from Pangburn High School in 2021. He was employed at Choate Machine & Tool in the plastics department. From the moment he came into our lives, Logan filled our hearts with immeasurable love and laughter. With each passing year, he blossomed into a remarkable young man. From pulling himself up at 7 months and started walking on his own, to being an adult in the Army National Guard, Combat Engineering Unit.

“ I want to leave a couple of memories so everyone can read them and hopefully smile. We all miss Logan. We will until we meet again.

When Logan would get embarrassed, he would get so flushed in the cheeks it would look like someone slapped him.

He had porcelain skin. My kiddo couldn't ever tan. He had that Irish blood deep within him. He would be paper white, or lobster. Nothing in between.

We were driving to Mount Magazine to go hiking. Me, him, and Avery. Ascending up one of the massive hillsides, Logan looked out the window and said, "Look! a quail!" We all looked and burst out in laughter because it was a turkey. "That's the biggest quail I've ever seen, son! Like dinosaur sized quail!"

When he was a little boy, around 2, I was driving him to the Lolipop Daycare in Bald Knob. We lived right down the road from the daycare so instead of fighting him to sit in his booster seat, I told him he could be a big boy and sit up front with mommy in the passenger seat. His eyes got SO big and he said, "I get to be a big boy mamma!" I said, "Yes baby, you're such a big boy!" We got to the stop sign and lightning crashed over head. He looked up and pointed and said, "oOoOo ightning mamma, IGHtning!"

When Logan was an infant, he had a pacifier that he was very particular to called a gerber gem. We used to flip it upside down on purpose so he would giggle and flip it around with his tongue like it was a game. He was always happy.

I'm so very proud of Logan's accomplishments in life. He was diagnosed with Asperger's at the age of 8. He didn't have very many true friends until he got in the 5th grade. He was always called, "weird." All because he thought differently than anyone else. He struggled in school with his ADHD because none of the medications on the market worked with his system. He surpassed

everyone's expectations when he graduated from Boot Camp and AIT. He thought it was fun going through the gas chamber so he did it three times. That's my overachiever! I don't know where he got it from. He was SO very proud to be in the Army. He enjoyed going to drill in Harrisburg at the Combat Engineering Unit.

Logan walked his own path in life. Always smiling. He didn't care if anyone did what he did, he just did his own thing. He was the most responsible 21 yr old that I've ever known. I wasn't that responsible at 21.

We all will miss him dearly. I just ask, please keep his memory alive. Remember him walking the halls of Pangburn School with his fedora on and a permanent smile. He was always in that large camo coat that carried everything except the refrigerator in the pockets. Even when it was 100° outside.

Logan loved everyone and treated them the way he wanted and deserved to be treated. He had THE biggest heart around. Always had a heart to help people or try and fix them. He was always donating to certain charities and volunteering his time to help people out. He always made an effort to tell anyone he seen in military uniform, "thank you for choosing to serve!"

Logan, I love you so very much! Avery and I miss you more than words can explain. There aren't any words to express just how much we will miss you. We know that we will see you again.
