I left my home state about 70 years ago, never to return as a resident. I did keep up with Florene and visited her when she lived in Florida. We began to see each other about once a year in recent years after we both became grandparents, Either at Russell reunions or at her home in Conway.

I have enjoyed every minute I spent with my cousin in these past 80 years or so, and I am certain that she would say the same. I will miss this beloved relative and life-long friend.
