Ollie Z. Couch Golleher was born April 25, 1916 in Argenta, Arkansas, which is now North Little Rock. She departed this life June 21, 2009 in Searcy, Arkansas at the age of 93. She was the daughter of the late Maud Killman Couch and Eddie Gabe "Ed" Couch.

Mrs. Golleher was a 1938 graduate of Harding College. She did post-graduate work at Southern Arkansas University while a social studies teacher at Barton Junior High in El Dorado.
