Oma Bea (Nuckolls) Morris, age 91, of Searcy, died peacefully in her sleep at home early Wednesday morning, April 16, 2008, surrounded by her family. She was born on September 7, 1916 to the late Charles and Ella Ann (Walker) Nuckolls, near the Walker Community in southern White County. Her family later moved to Higginson and then on to Searcy in search of a better education for the children. Oma Bea graduated from Searcy High School and attended Harding College.
