Ronald Feather, 68, of Searcy, went home to be with his Lord and Savior just after midnight on Friday, December 6. Ronnie was born on January 25, 1945 in Searcy, Arkansas, the only child of Albert Johnson Feather and Vera Vivian Pence Feather. He grew up in Griffithville where he loved fishing with his father. He joined the Army National Guard shortly after graduating high school and served in Fort Polk, Louisiana and in Heber Springs, Arkansas for six years.
