Theo David "Red" Mullens of Rose Bud, Arkansas (formerly of Benton) passed from this life on Saturday June 27, 2020 at the age of 99 years. He was born April 27, 1921, in Little Rock, Arkansas to the late John D. and Annie Mae Mullens. Preceding him in death was Ellon Mullens his wife of 52 years and his friend and companion of the last several years, Frances Roller. He was also preceded in death by one son, Jerell Lynn Mullens (Barbara) of Benton.

He is survived by one son Therell R. Mullens (Ann) of Rose Bud, a sister Edna Berry of Little Rock: two granddaughters; Kansas Harper (Rob) of Missouri City, Texas and Jerelynn Mullens of Benton. Two great grandsons, Cade Harper and Ian Harper of Missouri City, Texas. Also left to cherish his memory are 4 step grandchildren and 12 step great grandchildren, as well as many friends and extended family members.

Red served our country in the U.S. Army during World War II and was proud to be involved as a participant in liberating POWs from Japan after the bombings there. He also was a long time former member of the Shriners of Arkansas where he actively participated in service to that organization in many ways.
