Violet Nadean McAdams, 90, of Providence, went to be with the Lord on Saturday, October 1, 2022 at her home surrounded by her family. She was born June 20, 1932 in the Step Rock Community a daughter of the late Edgar and Nola Ellen (Hubach) Bell. Ms. Nadean was a devoted Christian lady and was a long time member of the Providence Missionary Baptist Church. She was a dedicated supporter of Missions in India and Bro. K.S. Babu and continued to contribute resources until her passing. She founded the first Alzheimer support group in White County and, in the late 1980's, received the Caregiver of the Year award from Governor Bill Clinton. She was a huge advocate for individuals with handicap, working closely with Barrier Awareness, she was instrumental in getting ramps built to ensure easier and safer accessibility to homes as well as county buildings. Her life was one of service, love and kindness; always putting the needs of others first. She was devoted to the care of her family and loved being surrounded by her children and grandchildren. Nadean was a homemaker, enjoyed working outside and was also an avid reader.

She is survived by her children, Harold Heidelberg, Jr. (Darilyn), Shari Sterling (Jimmy), Patti Nell Goff (Ronnie) and Wayne Heidelberg (Anita); 8 grandchildren, Christal Suttner, Darrin Sterling, Samantha Manues, Sean Heidelberg, Shannon Reynolds, Micah Goff, Wesley Heidelberg and Heidi Daughety; 15 great-grandchildren; 7 great-great-grandchildren and a half-brother, David Moser.
