Winfred Dean Louks, 87, of Searcy, died Thursday, April 8, 2010. He was born November 1, 1922 in Bald Knob, the son of Garland and Nola Hulseby Louks.

Winfred is survived by his wife of 35 years, Juanita; a son, Larry Louks of San Antonio, Texas; two daughters, Debbie Mount of Jackson, Louisiana and Jane Howard of Diamond Head, Mississippi; two step-daughters, Nola Ford of Maumelle, Arkansas and Susan Presley of Lakewood, Washington; eight grandchildren, 16 great grandchildren; a brother, Ray Louks; two sisters, Jean Altom and Sue Helm; and several nieces and nephews.
